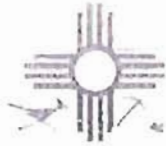

PURCHASE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into effective December 30, 2013, by TAMARA PACE, a single woman, (the "Seller"), and STEVE EDMONSON, a married man, (the "Buyer"). The Agreement is also joined by SOCORRO COMMUNITY RADIO, L.L.C., a New Mexico limited liability company (the "Company"). The Seller, the Buyer, and the Company shall be referred to jointly below as the "Parties."

RECITALS:

The Seller is the owner of a membership interest in the Company (the "Membership Interest"); and

The Seller desires to sell all of the Membership Interest to the Buyer and the Buyer desires to purchase all of the Membership Interest, pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms, conditions, and covenants set out below, it is agreed as follows:

1. **Purchase.** The Seller shall sell and the Buyer shall purchase all of the Membership Interest. Following the Closing of said purchase, the Buyer shall own Seller's membership interest in the Company.

2. **Purchase Price.** The purchase price for the Membership Interest (the "Purchase Price") shall be as follows: the Buyer shall pay to Seller three percent (3%) of any net profit of the Company for a period of three (3) years commencing January 1, 2014. The payments shall be made annually on or before February 1 for the preceding year, beginning February 1, 2015. In addition to the payments, the Buyer shall also provide Seller with copies of any and all financial information for the Company supporting the calculation of net profit for the preceding year no later than February 1. If after review of the financial information Seller reasonably believes that Buyer's calculation of net profit is in error and Seller and Buyer are unable to agree on the amount to be paid by Buyer, the dispute shall be settled as set forth below.

3. **Closing.** The Closing of the purchase of the Membership Interest provided by this Agreement shall occur on or before December 31, 2013, at a location agreed to by the Parties. At the Closing, the Seller shall deliver to the Buyer an assignment of the Membership Interest, representing all of Seller's interest in the Company.

4. **Warranties and Representations of the Buyer.** The Buyer represents and acknowledges that the following are true and correct as of the date of execution of this Agreement and will be true and correct at the date of the Closing:

4.1 The Buyer has, or by the Closing Date shall have, made all necessary arrangements to complete the purchase in accordance with the terms hereof.

4.2 The Buyer has full right, power, legal capacity and authority to enter into this Agreement and to perform the obligations hereunder.

4.3 This Agreement has been duly executed and delivered by the Buyer, and constitutes the valid and legally binding agreement and the obligation of the Buyer.

4.4 There are no actions, suits, proceedings or investigations pending or, to the knowledge of the Buyer, threatened against or affecting the Buyer, at law or in equity, in any court, or before any federal, state, or municipal or other agency that, if successful, would prevent Buyer from performing his agreements and covenants in fulfilling his obligations under this Agreement.

4.5 The Buyer understands and acknowledges that the Seller has made no statements, representations or warranties regarding the future business prospects and likelihood of future success of the Company, and that the Seller cannot be relied upon in predicting the future financial success of the Company and the future value of the Company.

5. **Warranties and Representations of the Seller.** The Seller makes the following representations and warranties:

5.1 The Seller is the owner of a membership interest in the Company. The Membership Interest is free and clear of all liens and encumbrances.

5.2 The Seller has full right, power, legal capacity and authority to enter into this Agreement and to perform the obligations hereunder.

5.3 This Agreement has been duly executed and delivered by the Seller, and constitutes the valid and legally binding agreement and the obligation of the Seller.

5.4 There are no actions, suits, proceedings or investigations pending or, to the knowledge of the Seller, threatened against or affecting the Seller, at law or in equity, in any court, or before any federal, state, or municipal or other agency that, if successful, would prevent Seller from performing her agreements and covenants in fulfilling her obligations under this Agreement.

6. Company and Buyer to Indemnify and Hold Harmless the Seller. The Company and the Buyer shall indemnify and hold harmless the Seller from and against any and all claims and liabilities which may arise from damage or injury to any person or property, or for any other reason, resulting from or related to the business activities and operations of the Company and the Buyer, which claims or liabilities arise following the effective date of this Agreement.

7. No Compliance with State or Federal Securities Laws. All of the Parties to this Agreement acknowledge that no filings or disclosures have been made by the Company, or by the Seller, pursuant to the securities laws and regulations of the State of New Mexico and of the United States. The Parties hereby waive the making of any and all such disclosures.

8. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of New Mexico.

9. Binding Effect. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective heirs, executors, legal representatives, successors and assigns.

10. **Waiver and Unenforceability of Provisions.** Any term or condition of this Agreement may be waived at any time by the Party that is entitled to the benefit thereof, but only if such waiver is evidenced by a writing signed by such Party. Such waiver shall not affect the enforceability of any provision of this Agreement. In addition, if any provision of this Agreement is found to be unenforceable, all other provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect.

11. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement supersedes all prior understandings and agreements between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and contains the entire understanding and agreement of the Parties with respect to the transaction covered hereby.

12. **Amendment.** This Agreement shall not be modified or amended, except in writing executed by all of the Parties hereto.

13. **Attorneys' Fees.** In the event of any action or proceeding brought by any party under this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover its expenses and costs, including its attorneys' fees and expert witness fees in such action or proceeding, including costs of appeal, if any, in such amount as may be determined to be reasonable.

14. **Survival.** All of the representations and warranties herein, including the obligation of the Buyer to pay Seller a portion of any net profit of the Company, shall survive the consummation of the transactions hereunder.

15. **Arbitration.** The parties shall endeavor in good faith to resolve all disputes arising under or related to this Agreement by mediation according to the then prevailing rules and procedures of the American Arbitration Association. If the parties fail in their attempt to resolve such disputes by mediation, they shall submit such disputes to arbitration according to the then prevailing rules and procedures of the American Arbitration Association. New Mexico law shall govern the rights and obligations of the parties with respect to the matters in controversy. The arbitrator's award shall be final and binding and judgment may be entered in any court of competent jurisdiction.

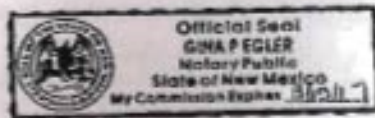

We do not have to and should not tell him that I will be the manager.

I need to have him give me back control of any and everything related to the station immediately. He has effectively conceded that I am the owner of the station at this point and I see no reason for him to maintain control of any aspect of it. In their answer to our complaint they said the following: "Plaintiff has always maintained ownership of any assets in which they now claim a security interest, which have not been transferred to the Defendants." and also "There is nothing for the Special Master to sell, as the Defendants do not own any of the radio stations (sic) assets, including the FCC license." If that is the case how can they refuse to return these assets upon our demand?

I will come and get the equipment at the end of the week if we can get him to agree to give it to us or compel him to give it to us. Please contact me at your earliest possible convenience so that we can discuss how to proceed in light of this new information.

FCC ELIMINATES MAIN STUDIO RULE

Action Will Further Reduce Regulatory Burdens and Costs for Broadcasters

WASHINGTON, October 24, 2017—The Federal Communications Commission today eliminated the broadcast main studio rule. The Order retains the requirement that stations maintain a local or toll-free telephone number to ensure consumers have ready access to their local stations.

The main studio rule, adopted nearly 80 years ago, currently requires each AM radio, FM radio, and television broadcast station to have a main studio located in or near its local community. The rule was implemented to facilitate input from community members and the station's participation in community activities.

The Commission recognizes that today the public can access information via broadcasters' online public file, and stations and community members can interact directly through alternative means such as e-mail, social media, and the telephone. Given this, the Commission found that requiring broadcasters to maintain a main studio is outdated and unnecessarily burdensome.

Elimination of the main studio rule should produce substantial cost-saving benefits for broadcasters that can be directed toward such things as programming, equipment upgrades, newsgathering, and other services that benefit consumers. It will also make it easier for broadcasters to prevent stations in small towns from going dark and to launch new stations in rural areas.

Action by the Commission October 24, 2017 by a Report and Order (FCC 17-137). Chairman Pai, Commissioners O'Rielly and Carr approving. Commissioners Clyburn and Rosenworcel dissenting. Chairman Pai, Commissioners Clyburn, O'Rielly, Carr and Rosenworcel issuing separate statements.

I am agreeable to the proposal you have made, but would like to get 41K plus getting to keep any money in the Socorro Community Radio account in excess of \$5000 after all paying all obligations through the end of May. Janca Fails to Get Financing and 1st Sale Offer Dead



"One-Oh-Two". The mayor's name is pronounced "Bass-Ker" not "Ba-Shear". In the report you talk about Mr. Romero, but don't say who Mr. Romero is. On the youth employment you don't identify that it is the City's Youth employment program. If this is going to be your only news update for the day you don't want to say good morning. Even if you plan to do a second update to run from 1p-7p this one will run at noon, so it will no longer be morning. When you closed you said that it was a Mine Country Update rather than a Mine Country One-Oh-Two-One update and you said "I Reese Janca on One-Oh-Two-Point-One" rather than One-Oh-Two-One. Again, it is about staying consistent with your branding. My suggestion is to open with something like "I'm Reese Janca with your Mine Country One-Oh-Two-One news update" and close with something like "I'm Reese Janca and this has been a news update on Mine Country One-Oh-Two-One, Socorro's Hometown Station!" The story selection is good, but I would suggest just trying to do 2 stories per update and slowing down a bit and making sure to give details like saying Councilman Peter Romero and identifying that you are talking about the City's Summer Youth Employment Program.

Second, don't worry about Sonic I have taken care of that issue.

Third, very disappointing news on purchasing the station. I do not want you to change the license over to you under these conditions. Without control of the FCC license the station is worthless to me. I will consider your new offer, but it will now have to be considered along with other offers that may be made by others that have expressed interest in purchasing the station. We had an agreement on terms that I was committed to keeping and I did not consider any other offers as I promised. With that agreement being broken I believe I am ethically cleared to consider other offers that might be available. As stated earlier I will still consider your new offer, but if there is a better one available I will take it. At \$500 a month it would take nearly 7 years for you to pay \$41,000 and I would prefer not to drag things out that long. I would also have to raise the price some to make up for the risk of inflation. Maybe you can find someone in town to partner with you on this endeavor so that we can maintain the original agreement that was made. I will still honor that agreement if you get back to me before I make an agreement to sell to someone else. Otherwise, you will be competing in an open market with the best offer winning. No hard feelings, I just have to try to make the best deal I can at this point. If anything changes let me know. Please finish out the week on Sunrise Socorro and if nothing works out I will just suspend the program for the time being. Also, please return anything that was removed from the studio.

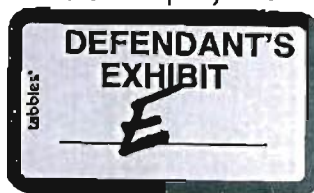

Here is the best way for us to proceed and if you agree we will proceed.

Close out the Socorro Community business account with First State Bank and take the \$3000 balance as proceeds from the sale. I have \$10k in capital I can get you plus a monthly payment the week of the 17th. I have operating capital that can keep the station going and make the repairs and updates that need to be made to the station over the next couple of months. **Currently, less than 10% of the stations inventory is sold and most of the annual contracts you have already collected on.** The sales I am working on will come directly to the new business so I won't need the Socorro Community account.

If you take the \$3k in the account, \$2k in June and July monthly payments and an additional \$10k deposit this month that will give you \$15k toward the sale. I will continue you making monthly payments and give you another lump sum payment by October of \$10k which will give you the deposit you are seeking. I would prefer to maintain the terms you drew up and had agreed to, but I will accept the new ones. The reason I was going to leave you \$3000 was to let you have the money that came from 1st State Bank and Socorro General Hospital for spots that have yet to run and give you some capital to cover immediate operating costs. However, if you prefer you can choose make that money part of your payment. We need to transfer billing for the phones, music licensing, etc. to you. Currently, Centurylink, the bank internet service, Zipwhip, and ASCAP fees are among things that are auto deducted from the SCR account. Have you made arrangements for 1st State and Centurylink to bill you for their services? If you want to keep Zipwhip you need to let me know and we need to make arrangements to have the billing switched to your accounts, otherwise I will just end it.

Unless something has changed since last Wednesday afternoon, when we left Socorro, the coverage seems to be the same as usual. I drove from Albuquerque and Belen within the last 2 weeks several times and I did not notice any difference in the coverage from what it has been over the time I have owned the station. You need to replace the production computer, as I had told you long ago, due to its outdated operating system. I believe the Natural Log computer is functional for now. I think some of the problems I had accessing it were due to issues on this end rather than with the Natural Log computer. I'm sure there are other improvements that can be made, but I don't think most are urgent. I could be wrong.

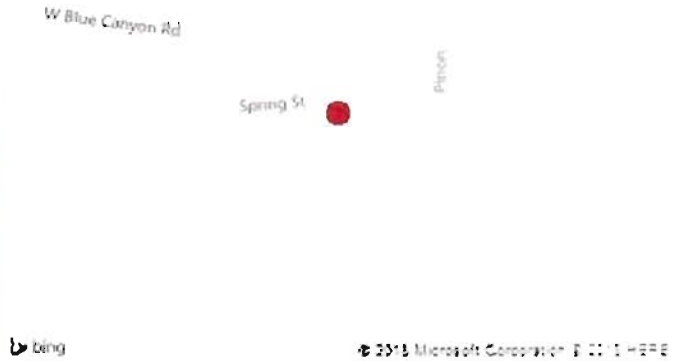





Request for Special Temporary Authority

Dear Media Bureau,

I am formally requesting a Special Temporary Authority to continue to the operation of KYRN-FM 164088 serving the rural communities surrounding Socorro, New Mexico where a *'delay in the institution of a temporary operation would seriously prejudice public interest'*.

A Special Temporary Authority to operate is needed to preclude a request to take KYRN a local community station off-air by Steve Edmondson who is no longer a manager of Socorro Community Radio LLC., due to incompetence and relocation. The station is an important part of the community featuring local news, events and most recently 4 hours of local election coverage plus candidate interviews during the local municipal election under Green Lyon's operation.

Former Socorro Community Radio LLC manager, Steve Edmondson has been requested to file the Change of Ownership paperwork since August 2017 and refused Michael Wagner's recent advice and requested additional monies to comply with the request to cooperate and file the FCC 314 as required. Steve Edmondson has been advised and is now seeking permission to take the station off-air for his failure to comply with the license requirements as the manager.

"You will need to work together, because there is a section for both the seller (Socorro) and the buyer (you). I also caution you that Socorro should refund any purchase price you have paid, because the Commission will not approve an assignment application if the entire purchase price has been paid before we even see an application. If Socorro drags its feet, consider legal action in a local court for specific performance to compel Socorro to cooperate in filing the application"

Michael Wagner, Assistant Chief, Audio Division Media Bureau Tuesday February 27th 2017 in an email response to Green Lyon's Mr. Janca's inquiry.

Green Lyon LLC has been operating KYRN-FM Facility ID 164088 after entering a sales agreement with Steve Edmondson to purchase the station upon the FCC's consent. Steve Edmondson assisted in the physical relocation of station assets to Green Lyon LLC's studio in Socorro and surrendered full control in August 2017. Steve Edmondson has repeatedly denied request to cooperate in filing the Change of Ownership paperwork since accepting tendered payment for sale and relocating to Dubuque Iowa in June 2017.

Green Lyon as Registered Agent for Socorro Community Radio LLC., a business licensed in the State of New Mexico asserts,


Steve Edmondson has failed to comply with the Operating Agreement accepted by the FCC among other negligent actions which prejudice the public interest served by KYRN-FM. Green Lyon LLC has placed itself at risk continuing the public service provided by KYRN-FM to the rural communities surrounding the City of Socorro and now seeks a Special Temporary Authority to continue operating until issues surrounding ownership and membership rights of Socorro Community Radio LLC are resolved.

Technical operation would continue as presently operational and licensed to Socorro Community Radio LLC from Green Lyon LLC station and facilities in Socorro County New Mexico under local General Management of Tom Reese Janca KD7GSB with GROL license PG-GB-043360 until the FCC formally approves the ownership and control transfer requested.

A Special Temporary Authority to operate would allow KYRN to continue operations broadcasting community beneficial programming and emergency alerts within the Rio Grande Valley in proper execution of the license.

Anticipate duration of Special Temporary Authority necessary to resolve change of ownership issues and concerns not to exceed 180 days.

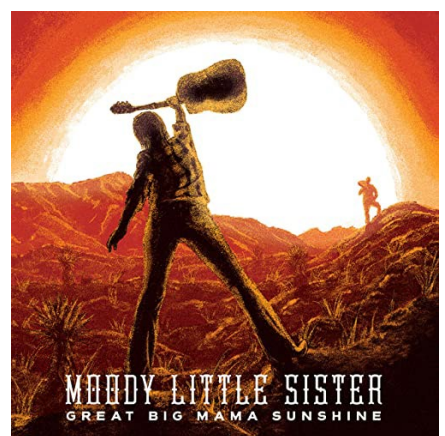
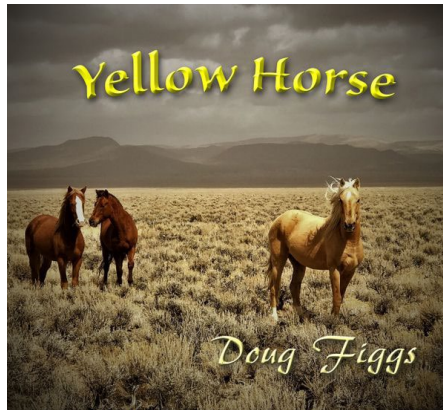

Music for the western way of life

*Yippie-yi-yo and away we go,
With a gallop and a cowboy yell,
Swinging in the saddle and herding the
cattle,
With a song and a story to tell ...*
— Riders in the Sky

Painting a broad canvas of cowboy country would not be complete without the songs that tell of the life of a cowboy. In other words, authentic western music.

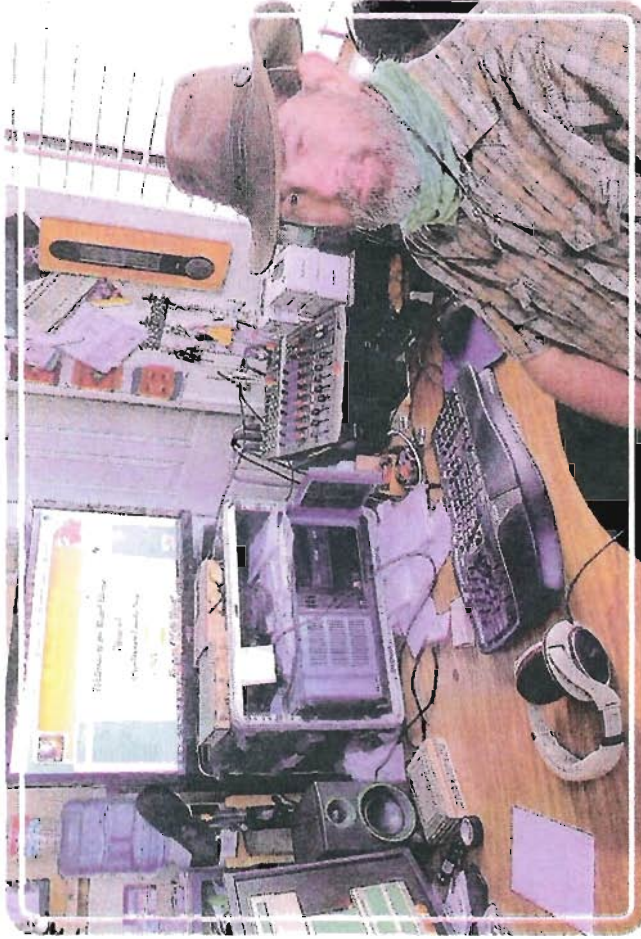
Authentic western music can be described as a subgenre of country and western, and sometimes referred to as western-country, but regardless of how its labeled, the songs are rarely heard on your favorite country radio station. But thanks to a two-hour program streamed on the internet every Wednesday night, listeners can be introduced to the latest releases from cowboy singers and songwriters.

The program, "Keepers of the West," originates from the Socorro, home of Reese Janca. He co-hosts the show with Doug Figgs, himself a multiple award-winning cowboy artist.

"A lot of the artists we feature are actual ranchers or cowboys, whether they work on a ranch or they own a ranch, like Doug Figgs, of Lemitar. He's a farrier and he runs his own cattle."

Janca says cowboy music is not necessarily what one may think of as country music. He traces the genre back to a migration from the south to the west that occurred following the Civil War.

"Many farmers whose life changed after the Civil War decided to go west and become cowpunchers," he said. "A lot of them were bringing their English and Irish ancestry with them westward. The early

cowboys on cattle drives." It was not until the early 20th century that western music came into its own, owing in part to the songwriting of New Mexico songwriter Jack Thorp. Then Hollywood took over.

"You had your Gene Autry, Roy Rogers and the other singing cowboys capitalizing on the romance of the Old West in the movie industry," Janca said.

Popular cowboy singers in the 1950s, such as Tex Ritter, Rex Allen and Frankie Laine, brought cowboy songs to a mass audience with hits like the themes to "High Noon" and "Rawhide."

"But then, there is the singer that everybody that I know of in western music, Billy Brantley from Brady and that

Texas cowboy with a half-top horse trailer and trying to get around amongst the stickers and the brushes.

Humor is not lost in the genre, as Brian Fritz sings about a three-legged, one-eyed cow that's really difficult to wrangle into a herd and gives the cowboys a run for their money in his song "Cow on a Mission"

And female artists are not left out. Not by a long shot.

Jean Prescott, in her song, "Ranch Wife Prayer," gives the perspective of the lifestyle of a ranch woman and her family and kids.

Trinity Seely sings "All the Things Time Hasn't Healed," about the ranching life and the fear of having to move away from it.

Quemado," he said. "New Mexico has such a rich western music heritage. We play songs by Jim Jones out of Albuquerque, Syd Masters from Red River, Earl Gleason from Belen and Socorro's own Kyle Martin. He's an interesting artist because he calls his music western rock."

Other artists from around the state include Jim Jones, Dave Stamey, Randy Huston, Paul Kelly, Moody Little Sister, and R.W. Hampton.

Janca maintains that there is a growing awareness and interest in western style country music

"Part of that is the reaction to pop-country. The reaction to the commercialized cosmopolitan country that doesn't celebrate or engage the agricultural, outdoor lifestyle," he said. "Whereas the cowboy and rancher might say it's fine living out here in the middle of nowhere and I'm happy about the choices I made."
